New Vigil Mass to Begin Feb. 4

**Saturday Masses at Jackson, Ione and Sutter Creek to be
Combined at Parish Center at 5:00 p.m.
Confessions from 3:30 to 4:30 p.m.**

Since Christmas it has been announced that beginning Saturday, Feb. 4, there will be offered two Vigil Masses in Amador County: St. Bernard's, Volcano at 4:30 p.m., and the Parish Center in Martell at 5:00 p.m. (Please note, the start time for St. Bernard's will be evaluated in the future should two priests be needed to hear confessions at the Center. For the time being, however, it will remain at 4:30 p.m.)

The new Vigil Mass at the Center will replace the current Saturday Masses offered at Sacred Heart (4:30 p.m.), St. Patrick's (6:00 p.m.) and Immaculate Conception (6:00 p.m.). Fr. Relihan, Pastor Emeritus, will celebrate the Mass on the Vigil of the last Sunday of the month at the Parish Center in Martell. The current Sunday Mass schedule will continue as usual at all six churches in the county.

Until the new church is completed at the Center, Mass will be celebrated in the front, social hall area. Plans are underway to provide for the needed sanctuary platform, altar and ambo, sound system and numerous other items required. As you know, there is large ample, lighted parking area that provides easy access. Restrooms are also available inside adjacent to the seating area for Mass.

Confessions will also be transferred from the three churches to the Parish Center and will be available from 3:30 to 4:30 p.m., in a room adjacent to the temporary chapel area. Both anonymous and face-to-face confessions will be available.

I am grateful to members of both the Parish Pastoral Council and, most recently, the ad-hoc planning team for the new Vigil Mass led by Deacon Ed. We are striving to ensure all liturgical ministers (music ministers, servers, lectors, ushers, Eucharistic Ministers, and many others) who are serving at Sacred Heart, Immaculate Conception and St. Patrick's are invited and encouraged to participate. Their assistance is greatly needed and appreciated. I know this will require a change in some people's schedule, particularly for many seniors who find it difficult or impossible to drive at night. Please know Fr. Roland and I realize and honor your shared sacrifice and ask for your ongoing support as the churches of our new, county-wide parish of St. Katharine Drexel unite and become stronger for future generations.

Please note, for those new to the “Building Repair Fund” second collection, these are funds used for the repair and maintenance of existing facilities. These are not used for construction or renovation expenditures at the Parish Center in Martell. If you wish to ensure the funds are restricted to your particular church, then you must clearly indicate this on the check’s memo line or on the envelope. However, I hope you might consider in the future offering an undesignated gift which will allow it to be used wherever the immediate need is the greatest among our six churches. Either way, we will honor your wishes.

Why Meg and Frank Verardi give to the Annual Catholic Appeal

Meg and Frank Verardi of Immaculate Conception Parish in Sutter Creek are very particular about their donations to charity, wanting their financial contributions to benefit local causes that show results and accountability. They are among donors of \$1,000 or more to the Annual Catholic Appeal as “Co-Workers of the Bishop.”

In their hearts, they believe the appeal, and its focus on assisting people in need in their own neighborhoods, fits well with their need to give. They have been inspired by Bishop Soto’s words in the annual appeal video shown in parishes across the diocese. They like how the appeal has consistently focused on the needs of the people.

They first became aware of the depth of social service ministries in the diocese through their participation in the “Preserving Our Past, Building Our Future” capital campaign in the early 2000s. “This kind of giving back is the heart and soul of the church—what we should be doing,” Meg said. “That campaign captured our attention and we have continued with our support of social service ministries through the Annual Catholic Appeal. We think highly of the fact that 25 percent of our donation goes back to parishes for their own ministries to people in need.”



National Vocation Awareness Week to be celebrated in parishes in diocese Jan. 9-14

The Diocese of Sacramento and dioceses across the nation will celebrate National Vocation Awareness Week Jan. 9-14 as a time to encourage young people to think of considering a vocation to the priesthood or religious life. The week begins on the church’s celebration of the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, which falls on Jan. 9 in 2012. The feast marks the beginning of Jesus’ public ministry.

During these days, families and the parish community are urged to nurture the faith of their children to prepare them to respond to whatever God’s call is for them. Catholics are encouraged during this week to take time to pray for vocations to the priesthood and consecrated life; to reflect on our own vocation and strengthen their personal relationship with Christ; and to educate young people about the importance of silent prayer and taking the time to truly listen to God’s voice in our hearts.

We are expecting the media to cover a large turnout and a great show of support for the Week of Christian unity.

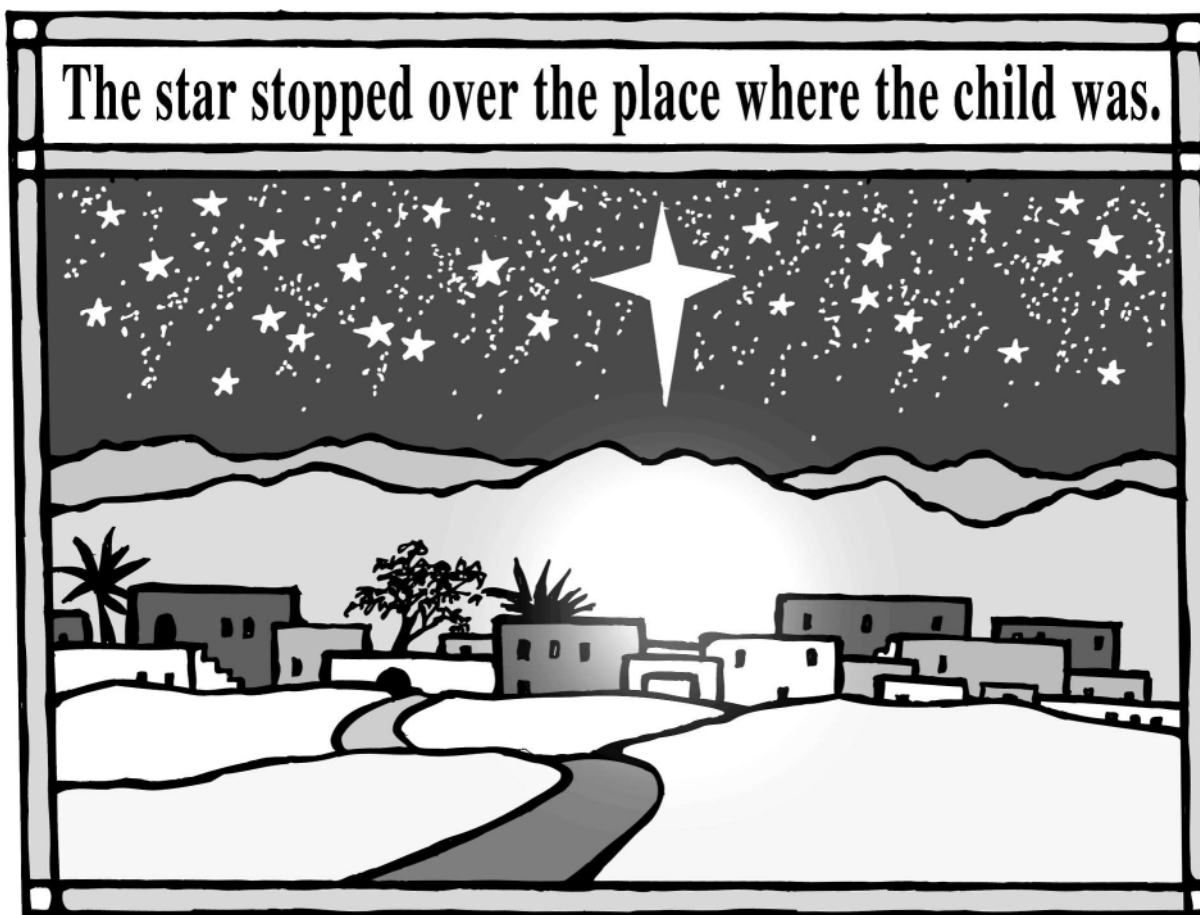

The Epiphany of the Lord

WHAT WILL THE NEIGHBORS THINK?

It must have been quite a sight on the streets of Bethlehem as the magi, those star-searchers, made their way to the house of Joseph (in Matthew’s Gospel the Holy Family are residents of Bethlehem until the flight to Egypt). Imagine the wonder that filled the eyes of the neighborhood children as this caravan made its way. Matthew doesn’t tell us many specifics about them (he never numbers them as three or calls them “kings”), but travel was hard in that time, and “safety in numbers” was the rule for making a long trek. Most likely it was a lengthy cortege that wound its way under the guidance of that star. If the celestial phenomenon that guided them there hadn’t already excited the village, the arrival of these women and men (in the ancient world astrologers and sign-readers were frequently female) with their dromedaries, unusual clothing, foreign ways—and gifts!—certainly would have roused the neighbors. News travels fast in small towns, and imagine the surprise when it was learned where these travelers stopped.

DON’T BE FOOLED

We can include the magi on our list of role models in faith for the season. They were not Jews, but were willing to follow a route that led to an insignificant and troublesome Roman province. When they were led to the Holy Family’s humble abode in Bethlehem they did not say, “No way! This can’t be the place. It’s too lowly, they’re not affluent enough.” They simply bowed down and worshiped Jesus the Christ, in a scene that prefigures the disciples bowing to worship him later in Matthew’s Gospel after his resurrection. These sign-seekers were willing to be led by their wonder, ready to persist in their journey, not knowing where the quest for their revelation would lead them, but open to its possible presence anywhere. We, like they, must be ready to seek the *epiphania*, the manifestation of God, earnestly and honestly, and be prepared to bow in worship when we find it.

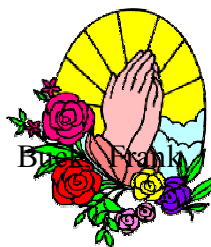
